












A MESSAGE FROM OUR CHIEF EXECUTIVE

It is so easy to sit in a meeting and talk about school improvement and partnership and all those buzz words but the real challenge is making it happen.



Schools improve because the right people are doing the correct jobs at a good pace. These schools are full of people who really want to make a difference to children and do just that. GCSE RESULTS 2019




