A MESSAGE FROM OUR CHIEF EXECUTIVE

I have often been asked about Multi Academy Trusts. Trusts have an interesting governance structure with members being the people who have the overall responsibility for the company of the Trust and the Trustees (sometimes called Directors) are the people who have the unpaid responsibility of making sure that the Trust serves the needs of the pupils it serves. A trust is a charity so those leading it need to demonstrate integrity and honesty.



Every school has its own Governance Advisory Board made up with staff, parents and co-opted members from the community the schools serve. Our schools are monitored and supported by the Trustees, members of the Governance Advisory Boards and the central team. We receive over 26 million pounds a year to operate our Trust and ensure that our pupils benefit from being part of Matrix.

Matrix Academy Trust has 4 schools with different strengths and intakes. Our schools are located in Walsall, Nuneaton and Birmingham. Three are secondary schools (11-18) and one is an all through school (pupils are aged 3 -18). All our schools have improved since joining the Trust with two schools being removed from special measures. The Trust includes a Teaching School Alliance, where we work with other schools providing training and we also have a SCITT (School centred initial teacher training) where we train graduates to become excellent teachers. As a Trust we grow our own teachers as we feel it is important to appoint the best staff possible and we can develop these new colleagues to become headteachers of the future. The staff share best practice and exchange ideas, schemes of work and training.

In 5 years' time the Trust will have grown to include more schools. Our vision for Matrix Academy Trust is to provide support and share excellence. What would this mean for a pupil in a Trust school?

Pupils are able to access a range of opportunities beyond quality teaching, for example membership of the Combined Cadet Force, the National Citizens Service (NCS) and the Duke of Edinburgh scheme. Our pupils are prepared for life after school in a safe learning environment and we aim to develop their resilience to the knocks that life will give them. We aim to have young people who are confident, healthy and full of enjoyment.




Friends of Bloxwich Academy

Swimming Pool Renovation

You may have read in the news that we have been awarded more than three quarters of a million pounds to completely overhaul our pool facilities. The facilities are used by members of the public as well as pupils from many of the local schools. The improvements will increase the life expectancy of the swimming pool by a further 30 years, securing its use for generations to come.

The £791,292 awarded by the Conditions Improvement Fund, using money obtained from the 'sugar tax', will be used to replace the tiling, windows, doors, lighting, heating and the pool's power plant. The improvements will also make the pool fully accessible for the first time with disabled access throughout the building.

As well as members of our community, many local schools use our pool. Each year, thousands of people enjoy our pool facilities and these works will guarantee thousands more will be able to do so in future.



Only days after hearing of Jacob's success, we learned about Jack's Aston Villa contract. Jack finished Year 11 in 2017 as well. We always say we are 'proud to succeed' and we could not be more proud of both boys.

Barr Beacon SCITT receives a glowing report from inspectors

Barr Beacon SCITT is celebrating an 'Outstanding' judgement from Ofsted having received the highest possible judgements in all four areas: quality of training, quality of leadership, outcomes for trainees and overall effectiveness.

Ofsted praised the "high quality training programme" and noted that "the quality of mentoring is consistently high". The report states that SCITT leaders demonstrate "very effective communication, support and engagement" and as a result there is a "very high level of satisfaction expressed by schools, trainees and newly-qualified teachers".

When inspectors spoke to former trainees they said that "the training year prepared them very well for the challenges they would face in their NQT year" and that "if they had their time again they would definitely go through the same training route." We think that this is a ringing endorsement of the quality of our programme.

Ofsted were particularly impressed with the strength of the training partnership, which includes schools across the Midlands. Ofsted were able to see "a genuine partnership with schools who contribute to the strategic direction of the SCITT, training and recruitment." The current SCITT partnership consists of: Barr Beacon School, Brownhills School, Bloxwich Academy, Codsall Community School, Dame Elizabeth Cadbury School, Elmwood School, Etone College, Grace Academy in Darlaston, and Ormiston Shelfield Academy.


National Professional Qualification for Middle Leadership

Middle leadership is frequently referred to as the 'engine room' of a school. But are all your middle leaders driving your school's improvement as effectively as they might? The Department for Education have developed the NPQML to give middle leaders all they need.

What's included in this comprehensive package:

- Department for Education NPQML accreditation.
- 12 course modules, covering everything a middle leader needs, including: articulating vision, leading change, managing resources, using data to target underperformance, using evidence to improve teaching and learning, building a high performing team and holding that team to account.
- A personal coach from the Senior Leadership Team of Barr Beacon School throughout the whole course.
- Access to the SSAT's Knowledge Hub platform.
- Personalised guidance on accomplishing their (and your) goals. To receive the NPQML, all participants
 will complete a 4,500 word assessment which we will mark and the SSAT will moderate. This project
 will be tied with your whole school development plan and their own personal performance.

We know that developing your middle leaders is a top priority but you also need them in the classroom as much as possible. Therefore, we have organised the programme to minimise disruption. The programme is delivered as 2 full days with 3 half days. The course cost includes lunch on the 2 full days and refreshments on the half days.
